Poinsettias

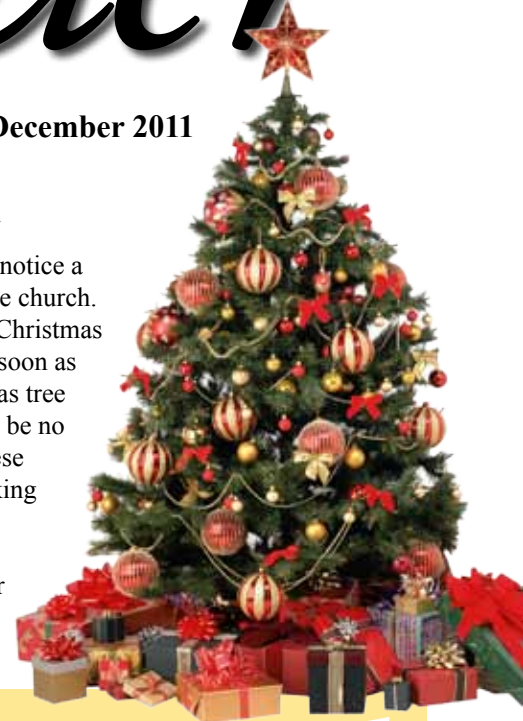

Reflections

TIME FOR EVERYTHING



There is a time for everything, a season for every activity under heaven.

A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant and a time to harvest. A time to kill and a time to heal. A time to tear down and a time to rebuild. A time to cry and a time to laugh. A time to grieve and a time to dance. A time to scatter stones and a time to gather stones. A time to embrace and a time to turn away. A time to search and a time to lose. A time to keep and a time to throw away. A time to tear and a time to mend. A time to be quiet and a time to speak up. A time to love and a time to hate. A time for war and a time for peace. (ECC 3:1-8)

This is a familiar scripture verse and also was a song in the 60’s called “Turn, Turn,” by The Birds. I think I find this meaningful this time of year. As I drive through the countryside, the farmers are in the midst of harvest time. We truly are the nation’s breadbasket. We live in world of continue change, but through all our changes it is important to pause and not forget.

On September 11, 2011, Dakota City and Homer United Methodist churches co-sponsor with the County Legion Posts and the County Local Fire Departments were all represented this candlelight vigil that was done for all of Dakota County – held in South Sioux at the Ave. of the Flags. This was done to honor the tenth anniversary of September 11, 2001. It was night of remembrance. All the area Legion posts were represented with the Commander Virgil Cleves, and all the First Responders – from Homer, Jackson, South Sioux, and Dakota City – we had 8 trucks with a ladder truck – with the red, white, and blue was hung. We had “Last Call” to honor the first Responders and 21 Gun salute for the men and women who have fallen during the wars. As we passed the light, we heard the recorded music of Bagpipe players playing “Amazing Grace” - God blessed us with a wonderful night. There were over 200 people in attendance.

If you missed that night; here is the glimpse of the message that I shared:

Tonight we come together to Never Forget
On that Night 10 years ago this Country was
United in its Grief
United in the Patriotism
United together in Worship
United in being one Nation under God

As we put our Lives on Pause

Let us once again commit ourselves to
Standing Together in Unity

Truly Call US the People of these UNITED states.

DC Minutes of Ad Board (September 13, 2011)

Present: Melvin S., Betty B., Connie A., Arnie A., Gordon P., Virginia P., Charlotte D., Barb S., Bev B., Shirley S., Opal S., John F., Pastor Jaon F., Barb M., Mardi S. Pastor Joan opened meeting with an article in the Messenger about Dakota City United Methodist Church, then prayer. Pastor led everyone to the Sanctuary for a power point on the Charge Conference which this year is Oct. 23rd at 2 pm in South Sioux City. A video was then presented on the United Methodist Church statistics since 1968 such as decline in growth, finance & membership. The General Finance Commission put together the statistics and for Jan. 2012 measure 5 numbers; worship attendance, small groups, Sunday School, mission outreach and mission shares. Two long term achievable goals to be put together for the year. Pastor Joan asked for goals that can be easily measured and assessed, there will be more discussion on this before the Conference date.

Meeting minutes read by Mardi and approved.

Financial Report/Charlotte - the last two checks written for apportionment's, there's four left at \$640, paid \$50 to UMCOR, General, CD Reimbursement and Video fund totals read, \$9,423.97 spent, \$7,415.67 taken in. Gordon reviewed 2012 budget, changes made to Church school supplies budget from \$1,000 to \$800. Karen asked what the giving totals were and if the budget was realistic based on that. Charlotte didn't have numbers to add all totals. John motioned to approve the budget, Bev second and all approved. Gordon stated the Pony Express would be sent out at the end of the month and asked about any fundraisers coming up, get any ideas to the finance committee.

Kitchen Report/Connie - \$29.46 income (cookies), \$22.50 expenses for coffee and towels, total balance \$624.68. Pastor had tried to get a list of volunteers from City Hall to plan a cook-out but couldn't get it so hold off on planning.

Witness Report - no report

Worship Report/Bev - Choir practice tomorrow night and average attendance is up six every Sunday over last year.

Education Report/Opal - Response this fall for Sunday School is not good, if there's not enough kids this Sunday then won't perform in service. Correspondence has been sent out for Sunday School and materials are in for all three classes.

Youth Report/Pastor Joan - Youth group starts tomorrow night and will meet in Homer, they will see how it goes and might meet in Dakota City for other dates. "Soul Surfer" devotionals were purchased and are being used for youth group. Youth are to participate in potato gleaning on Sept. 24 and crop walk Oct. 9th. Opal has seven children in her class that meet the requirement for youth group. Pastor Joan is checking into this.

Trustees Report/Shirley - Toilet re-installed with new hardware, sink drain ground out and plugs removed. Jackson Glass fixed kitchen window, the crib was repaired by Scott S. and Shirley contacted the insurance company they okayed the use of the crib in nursery. The lighting is to be addressed next week and no bench has been brought up yet but Shirley is planning to bring a smaller bench to try out. Home defense was sprayed inside and outside again.

Memorial Report/Barb S. - Balance is \$1,615.87

UMC Men's Report/Gordon - Group meeting in SSC Tuesday night at 7 pm.

SPRC Report/John - Group met the last Thursday in August with main goal being met of completing forms for Pastor's salary. The group also discussed future programming.

Communications Report/Melvin - Some errors were noticed in the Messenger article; quotations from Pastor Joan and the Church is 115 years old not 150. There currently is not enough time spent on planning or money budgeted for the video system on the 2012 proposal and funds left will maintain the system. A monitor is still needed for the Fellowship Hall in hopes of utilizing that room for Sunday service overflow and Sunday School or youth group activities/classes.

Pastors Report/Pastor Joan - Pastor covered Charge Conference which is being held in South Sioux City at 2 pm, October 23 and she would like two goals developed with involvement of the congregation. Pastor would like one goal done by next board meeting on October 4 and she is open to what the Church wants to do. Homer Church is doing part of Sunday service for planning the goals.

Misc items - Melvin working with the Sunday school group utilizing the video system for contemporary videos during opening session every Sunday.

Connie prompted discussion about the flag ceremony the evening of Sunday 9/11. The group shared positive comments and good attendance for the event.

- Minutes were read and approved with corrections. Treasurer's report was submitted with \$3,538.12 in available funds. P. Eslick made motion to accept, S. Barteer seconded and motion carried.

Old Business: It was noted amount budgeted for Vacation Bible School was surpassed and members should be reminded that we are no longer receiving the conference payment and special donations would be in order.

New Business: Sept. 24 is set for Potato Gleaning this year.

- The Lutherans are having their anniversary on Sept. 18, and the Catholics are having theirs on Sept. 25. A floral arrangement was given to St. Paul's earlier so it was decided to give one to the St. Cornelius as well.
- Church rummage date set for Oct. 8, 2011.
- P. Eslick submitted bill in the amount of \$84.92 for light bulbs and new runner for Church with the runner being returned for refund/exchange.
- Trustees met about the hail damage to the Church. Bids need to be made for repairs.
- The budget was revised for submission to the rest of the board for approval.
- Pastor reported that at Charge Conference, we are to submit 2 measurable goals and how they will be achieved along with 1 or 2 stories about this past year's accomplishments. Pastor suggested the very successful Bible School and how so many parents were involved this year and a story about returning inactive members might be used.
- It was decided to use part of worship on Sept. 25 as a board meeting so that all reports and the budget could be finalized prior to the Oct. 10 deadline to have all materials sent to conference.

Meeting adjourned.

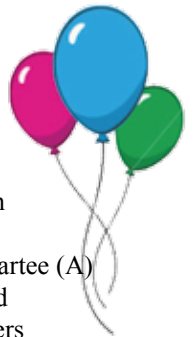
